## GOT HISTORY?

*There's no time like the present to learn more about Wheelock's past.*

### Early Wheelock Dowser

**A** document with a link to an early Wheelock ancestor was brought to our attention by Wheelock resident, Leigh Hurley.

The **History of ASD** (American Society of Dowsers), by Terry E. Ross II (1985), is his address to the Society on the 24th anniversary of their society's founding and its headquarters in Danville.

Ross begins his address describing a "seminal incident" for the society; the life and work of **Bezaleel\* Bemas** (sp.?) (There are various Bemas spellings, an early New England name, traced to Joseph who arrived in Massachusetts in 1619).

Ross states that Bezaleel was born around 1800 in Wheelock and he "learned how to make water pipes and pumps. He also discovered he was an able and reliable dowser."

Pipes and pumps were an improvement over open wells, so he made a good living as a technician installing these systems.

He had customers in a "territory extending north to Newport, west to Waterbury, and south to Woodstock." Ross reports that as he travelled, Bezaleel "saw the need along the roads for watering places for man and beast".

#### And he had a solution...

"...For a few pennies he bought old barrels, which he cut into two to make tubs. Wherever he went he would find a spring in a likely place, make a turnout in the road, set up the tub, and pipe water to it.

He dotted the area of his travels with these oases and would tack a Bible verse to a board over the tub. He was known throughout his territory as "Springwater Bemas". One was the All-Wright Spring on the North Danville Road."

Now called the **Allright Spring**, located at the extinct All-Wright Farm and water company. Due to nearby road construction there is no longer a spring, but the American Society of Dowsers is still in Danville. <https://dowsers.org/>

**\*Bezaleel**, is a biblical name which has influenced naming in religious families; meaning "in the shadow of God," and belonging to the master craftsman of the Tabernacle in the Old Testament.
